| Tue 22nd Oct | Northam Burrows Country Park | A guided walk on the history, archaeology and heritage of Northam Burrows (starts 2pm) |
| Tue 29th Oct | Torrs Walk , Ilfracombe | Safeguarding the 19th century limekiln and footpath repair, with the National Trust team |
| Thurs 31st Oct | Mine Tenement, Combe Martin | A guided walk followed by restoration work on the mine remains |
| Wed 13th Nov | Saunton Down | Scrub management to protect the medieval terraces |
| Thurs 21th Nov | Braunton Burrows | Uncovering the 'rocket wall', one of the hidden WWII features on the Burrows |
| Wed 27th Nov | Hartland Point | Revealing the foundations of the original radar station, RAF Hartland Point |
